Becher stehen im Mittelpunkt des neuen Hugo-Ball-Almanachs sowie neu entdeckte zeitgenössische Texte über Klabund. Nach München in die Zeit vor dem Ersten Weltkrieg führen neu entdeckte Texte über Klabund von Alfred Vagts sowie über Emmy Hennings und Johannes R. Becher von Friedrich Wilhelm Wagner. Wie die Dargestellten gehörten beide Verfasser zum erweiterten Kreis der Münchner Frühexpressionisten, zu dessen zentralen Figuren Hugo Ball zählt. Sprachkritische Einflüsse auf sein dadaistisches Werk werden im neuen Almanach ebenso näher untersucht wie der Einfluss des französischen Dichters Lautréamont auf ihn. Ausgehend von Lewis Carrolls Alice-Romanen wird über die Stellung von Kind und Kindheit in Dada reflektiert. Daneben wird der Roman Caravansérail (1924) des Dadaisten und Surrealisten Francis Picabia analysiert und die Frage gestellt, was populäre Avantgarden sind. Teil der internationalen Avantgarde seiner Zeit war Der Sturm, dessen geplante digitale Quellenedition vorgestellt wird – ebenso wie das neu eröffnete Christian Schad Museum in Aschaffenburg.
