Vielmehr steht selbst bei einem so bescheidenen Unternehmen wie dem unseren immer im Hintergrund, daß gerade das Thema Gehörlosigkeit eng mit der Geschichte der Mehrheitsgesellschaft selbst verknüpft ist: Bis ins 18. Jahrhundert hinein

lediglich als Behinderte thematisiert, sind die gehörlosen Gebärdensprecherinnen und -sprecher seit zweihundert Jahren Gegenstand von Diskursen geworden, die tief ins Selbstverständnis der modernen Gesellschaft hineinreichen. Auf den seit Diderots Brief über die Taubstummen nicht mehr abgerissenen philosophisch-anthropologischen Diskurs als solchen kann hier nicht eingegangen werden. Aber was in unserem Band als linguistisch-kognitionspsychologische Erkenntnis über Gebärdensprache diskutiert wird, beruht auf dem Fortgang dieses Diskurses, bei dem zunehmend nicht physiologische Defizite und Kompensationsleistungen im Mittelpunkt stehen, sondern die erstaunliche Sprachleistung, die von den Gehörlosen im Medium der von ihnen benutzten und tradierten Gebärdensprache erbracht wird. Vor allem durch Forschungen in den USA ist in den letzten 20 Jahren der volle grammatikalische Wert dieser eigentümlichen Sprache herausgearbeitet worden.
